Preparation

Revision cards



Revision cards



These make an effective portable set of revision materials.

They can be coloured or you can make them colourful.

Planning out how you will identify each subject before you start is a good idea, e.g. geography will be on blue cards, maths will be on white cards with a red line at the top.

There are several different ways to use the cards, but all of them create a resource that can be used in multiple ways.

Identifying key words and then using them in a paragraph.

- Put the key words for a topic on one side.
- On the other side use the keywords in a paragraph



Summarising a topic.

- Identify the key points in a topic.
- Write a 'mini mind map' on one side of the card
- On the reverse of the card give one or two questions relating to the topic.



Past paper practise.

- Put a past paper question on on side of the card.
- On the other side write out an answer using the mark scheme

Notes and questions.

- Create your notes (as we did a few weeks ago).
- On one side of the card use colour and drawings to illustrate a small section of your notes
- On the reverse write one or two questions about this small section.

Task for session 10

Use your note taking skills to identify the key points.

Write your concise notes onto one side of the card.

Write one or two questions on the back of the card (relevant to the information you have just written)

By completing the reverse of each card they can be used to self-test or for others to test you.
