### **GCSE Results 2019**

Once again, we are very proud of all our students, who have achieved another excellent set of results. Both pupils and staff have risen to the challenge of the more difficult GCSEs and turned in some exceptional performances.

English and Maths results continue to be of a very high standard. Provisional results show over 70% and 80% of pupils achieved a grade 9 to 4 in English and Maths respectively; with 70% achieving a grade 9 to 4 in both subjects.


There has also been a very strong performance in Science with 71% of pupils achieving two grade 4s or higher in the subject. The performance of the triple sciences was some of the best in the school with over 35% of pupils achieving grade 9 to 7 in Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

The performance of the core subjects combined with very strong attainment in the Humanities and Modern Foreign Languages has seen the school achieve a very strong figure of 21% this year for the more rigorous Ebacc, where a grade 5+ is required in all elements

### **2019 GCSE Process:**

200 children allocated four GCSEs

81% were allocated their first four choices

All but one pupil were allocated their first three choices

Only 6% of pupils had to have their 6<sup>th</sup> choice

Only one person has changed since start of the year

- Homework will be set each term. Pupils will need to research and prepare a short presentation, to deliver to the class, on a topic or theme linked to what is being studied in class.
- Regular reading is essential to support your child's progress. A list of suggested titles which sit alongside the topic studied each term is available on the school website.





